Routine Healthcare

Joel Silva with the City of Houston's Health Department spoke to us about better health care. Routine Healthcare involves screenings, vaccines, check-ups, and counseling to avoid disease and health issues.

He explained that many people postponed routine care services during the COVID-19 pandemic and delayed care, which led to complicated treatments and extended hospital stays. Preventive care is important to help detect chronic diseases early, prevent heart disease, diabetes, and obesity, and encourage regular medical and dental check-ups.

He explained that it is important to have regular checkups. The reason for these check-ups is to find out if you have arthritis, cancer, diabetes, heart failure, high blood pressure, osteoporosis, and strokes. It's also important to know your family history. Also, early screening can detect and treat cancers more effectively.

He also recommends that you talk to your doctor about getting vaccinated (COVID-19, Flu, and RSV) and getting a tetanus shot every ten years.

He said you must eat healthily, such as eating more fruits and vegetables and drinking water. Exercise is also important for keeping yourself healthy and fit. Go for walks, lift weights, use resistance bands, and do squats, pushups, and crunches.

He encourages everyone to say NO to smoking because of the risks of heart and lung disease and cancer.

It's hard to identify them when they are dressed like that.

They will go to a shelf and dump everything, such as aspirin, cough medicine, nose sprays, and makeup. Then, they will leave and sell all of that to people on eBay, flea markets, and individuals at night clubs/bars. They will charge a lot of money to profit for themselves.

They will arrive in stolen cars, making it difficult for the police to locate them. Even electronics, phones, laptops, etc., would be stolen for them to sell.

These people even going to stores that sell cigarettes, where the locks are cut, all those boxes are dumped into large black bags. Ciga-rettes can't be sold on eBay, as it's against the law.

One thing we learned about "Self-Serve" in stores is that a person can pretend that an item has been run through the system when it hasn't! So, these people walk out of the store with stolen items. Those gift cards at the stores are also used to take advantage of getting items free. It's fraud.
