#### Milly the deaf vixen learns sign language

When animal rescue expert Beth Tyler-King was handed an orphan deaf fox cub to look after, she knew exactly what to do - teach it sign language. Now the 18-month-old animal is called "Milly". Milly was first spotted when she was a 6-year-old pup being chased down a country lane in North Devon by 3 yobs (individual or thug). A family stepped in and rescued the vixen, which was badly cut and traumatized. Ms. Tyler-King is profoundly deaf. She explained how she developed a signing system to communicate with the animal by using her hand and finger.

Oshrain, who was born deaf, had been hired to teach hearing students at North Miami Beach Senior High. She was one of only 6 deaf teachers at traditional public schools in South Florida. But for Oshrain, an expressive and energetic woman with an obvious passion for her craft, connecting with students was never a problem. Today, all of Oshrain's sign language classes are full and more than 50 students are active in the school's American Sign Language Club.

# Pumpkin cake with cream cheese frosting

2 cups sugar

1 cup vegetable oil

4 large eggs

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking soda

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups pumpkin puree or cooked mashed pumpkin

cream cheese frosting, below

1/2 cup chopped pecans

Combine sugar, vegetable oil, and eggs in a large mixing bowl; mix well. Sift dry ingredients into a separate bowl; stir into oil mixture, beating well. Stir in pumpkin puree. Pour batter into two greased and floured 9-inch round layer cake pans. Bake at 350° for 35 to 40 minutes. Turn out onto racks to cool. Frost pumpkin cake with cream cheese frosting and sprinkle with chopped pecans.

Cream Cheese Frosting

1/4 cup butter

1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, room temperature

1 pound confectioners' sugar, sifted

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Combine all ingredients in large mixing bowl; beat well until smooth. Makes enough for 2-layer pumpkin cake. Submitted by Yvonne Butler.
