



Lewis Literary Society

In 1886 Dr. J. W. Blattner first organized the Lewis Literary Society. Dr Blattner was the principal of TSD for 25 years. L.L.S, was first named Advance Literary Society, but later it was changed to Lewis Literary Society in honor of Miss inly Lewis, Who was a teacher here for about 50 years. She was a deaf woman and spent most of her life living und Texas School for the Deaf. Regular meetings are held every two weeks, on Thursday nights. The programs consist of an address, poems, short stories, jokes, critic reports, announcements, and a closing prayer.

1947 Summary of Baseball Season

The baseball team won nine out of thirteen games this season. Among the outstanding players were Lee Montez, Gene Harkness, and Harold McDonald. Lee took the mound in all the games except one, winning eight and losing four. Harkness and McDonald, two of the team's strongest hitters, cooperated to give the team many of its earned runs. McDonald won a thriller for the Silents by driving in the winning run in the last half of the ninth, with two men out, to give a 4-3 victory over New Branufels. The Silents won another game with New Branufels on Field Day, the score being 9-3. Lee Montez on the mound, fanned 17 men. All players on the team this year are expected to return next year, and another successful season is anticipated.



SPORTS NEWS Do You Remember?

Little Rock, since 1949 to 1961, has played in AAAD National Tournament every year. Little Rock has won 13 straight y s in SWAAD. Houston, Dallas, San Antonio, Baton Rouge, Jackson Miss., and many others deaf club never had an o rtunity to play in AAAD because of Little Rock Ark Deaf Club had great players such as Clyde Nutt, Fay Nutt, Houston Nutt (3 brothers) and J.L. Jackson. Houston Deaf Club finally entered AAAD Tournament in 1962, San Antonio in 1963, Dallas in 1964 again with Clyde Nutt, Fay Nutt, Houston Nutt on their team. Also in 1966 Houston with Clyde, Fay and Houston entered AAAD won second place. Well we know the Nutt brothers were the great players. Clyde and Houston Nutt both had passed away. Fay Nutt and J.L. Jackson are still living.

Art Kruger wrote to Tom Withrow, Jr., author of <u>The History of the Texas School of the Deaf</u> <u>Football</u> and I quoted. "Having been a sport writer for 50 years, I still have not forgotten the 1947 T.S.D. football team, and I still consider it as the greatest deaf prep eleven of all time. Under the able direction of Coach Jesse Hawthorne, the amazing T.S.D. Silents went through the '47 campaign undefeated and untied, with a top-heavy total of 516 points to 13 for the opposition in nine games; therefore, they were accorded the accolade of National Deaf Prep Champions. The 516 total is still a national deaf prep record, and probably the nation's highest score for a high school team of all time. This team was led by national deaf prep scoring leader and national deaf prep football player of the year, Lee Montez, who is still considered as one of the all-time greats in deaf prep football".

Lee Montez, QB 1ST TEAM and Aaron Theriot Tackle 1ST TEAM were selected Deaf All-American 1946. In 1947 Lee Montez was selected first team All-Americans with other players, Olon Lawrence, tackle 1ST TEAM and Gene Harkness, center 1St TEAM. Aaron Theriot, tackle and James Fair, running back were selected second team All-Americans.

In 1947 Lee Montez tallied 30 touchdowns and 59 extra points for a season total of 239 points. He passed for five touchdowns. No one else came close.

Texas Silents (1947) Rated No. 1 Deaf Team of the Nation. Undefeated, Untied, Scoring 516 Points to 13 for Opponents Gridders of 1947 Establish New High Record for TSD

The Hawthorne boys brought their total for nine games to 516 points. This was 166 more than the college pace setters, Pepperdine College of Los Angels, Calif., and twelve more points than the a' time college team record for a single season which was made by Army in 1944. The victory over Goldthwaite was the Silents' seventeenth win in 19 games over past two years under the tutalage of Jesse Hawthorne---From The Lone Star
