La Grange Trip – Details

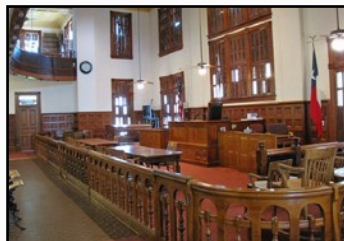


Texas Quilt Museum

Before the museum was established, the founders had the dream and goals for over 45 years. In La Grange, a 19th-century building was discovered with greatly needed restorations and historical luster. A second building was added at the time of processing. The exhibition space is over 10,000 square feet in three galleries. On November 13, 2011, the museum officially opened.

Back Porch BBQ & Grill

The family dreamed about opening a restaurant on their own back porch in Houston in spring 2011. The Back Porch was opened in April 2012. The menu includes slow-cooked and delicious BBQ, sides and desserts.



County Courthouse

The first hall of justice began a house/grocery store, which was purchased for \$250.00 and moved into the public square. Since 1838, the courthouse served its purpose until 1848. The second courthouse was built and then the third one was built in 1855. The fourth and final courthouse was erected in 1890.

The years spanning from 1891-1951, there were many various alterations including a Romanesque Revival structure. The 1913 flood covered the basement and the first floor with five feet of water.

Weikel's Bakery

The family migrated from Germany and started a business in 1929 with The Bon Ton Café. Brothers Alvin and "Pop" Weikel gave the German heritage and French-inspired cooking for locals, workers and travelers.

Alvin's son, Jim and his wife JoAnn, whose grandmother migrated from Czechoslovakia, started with a small local café on State Hwy 71. In 1985, "Bon Ton Store Bakery" was opened and was renamed "Weikel's Store and Bakery" – a well-known bakery by providing authentic Czech baked goods, mostly Kolaches.
