How Many of These Did YOU Know About?

(1) Use Empty toilet paper roll to store appliance cords. It keeps them neat and you can write on the roll what appliance it belongs to. 

Almond Bark Cookies by Margie Scribner

In the microwave, melt 2 packages of white almond bark. Add 1 cup of creamy peanut butter. In a separate large bowl, mix together 4 cups of Rice Krispies, 2 cups of mini marshmallows, and 2 cups of chopped nuts. Pour melted almond bark in the mixture. Drop by teaspoonful into waxed paper. Leave until set. Make approximately 6 doz. You may freeze them if you want to.
